### ANNUAL SPRING CLEANUP

- APPLICABLE RULES**

  - No hazardous waste such as paint, solvents, chemicals, etc.
  - No appliances with Freon
  - Loose items such as shingles, brush, insulation, etc. must be placed in bags or boxes
  - You will be required to unload your own vehicle. Township will only assist, if necessary

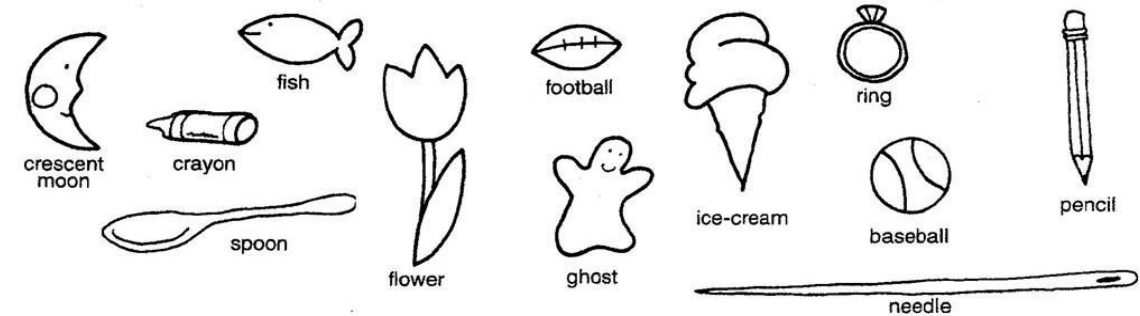

**NILE TOWNSHIP EMS SERVICES**

The Board of Trustees are pleased to announce that EMT-Ohio will continue providing full-time emergency medical services to Nile Township residents in 2025.

Nile Township will have squad coverage 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The service will continue to be stationed in our current EMS building allowing them to respond efficiently and effectively to any calls within the township.

These services will be provided under the current tax levy and residents will not see any tax increase as a result of this improved service.

As with our previous operations, no township resident will have to pay any out-of-pocket costs associated with any services provided.

Residents will still be able to call 740-858-4776 for non-emergency calls or 911 for emergency services. You may also stop in the station for blood pressure checks or any health emergencies.



## JOIN THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Nile Township VOLUNTEER Fire Department is made up of residents of Nile Township that VOLUNTEER their time serving the community. However, in recent times, we have seen the number of volunteers decline. This problem is NOT an isolated issue in Nile Township, but is a problem state wide. The Division of the State Fire Marshal has been studying this problem and is currently working on ways to address the issue.



There are a few misconceptions about joining the department that should be addressed:

1. I don't have the time:

⇒ The department is strictly voluntary. We all have multiple jobs and family life. Rarely does it happen that everyone in the department has the spare time. However, the more people we have on the roster the better our chances of appropriately responding to a call.

2. I'm too old:

⇒ The AVERAGE age of a volunteer firefighter in the State of Ohio is 54. That's the AVERAGE.

3. It costs too much:

⇒ **All of the training and equipment is provided to you at NO charge.** All that we are asking for is a few hours of your time.

If you have thought about joining the department, now is the time to step up and help out! We're all part of this township working together to keep it safe. Please feel free to stop by Station 1 on US 52 in Stout or Station 2 on US 52 in Buena Vista and talk to one of us. Meetings are held every Tuesday at 7pm. ### RECYCLING INFORMATION

The recycling dumpsters are provided to Nile Township by Lawrence Scioto Solid Waste Management District (LSSWMD).

The dumpsters are scheduled to be emptied every Tuesday.

**Please do your part by following these guidelines:**

1. **ONLY** place recyclable items in the dumpsters. Acceptable items are listed on Rumpke's website at [www.rumpke.com](http://www.rumpke.com).
2. Break down all boxes before placing in dumpsters.
3. If the dumpsters are already full, please **DO NOT** leave your items around the outside or on top of the dumpsters.
4. Please **DO NOT** leave your unwanted toys, household items, books, etc. by the dumpsters or anywhere on the township complex.



LSSWMD can remove our dumpsters due to misuse and/or abuse. Therefore, we need everyone to do their part in utilizing the dumpsters properly.

### NOTICE



The dumpster located at the community building is **NOT** for public use. We have had several instances where individuals have put their personal garbage in it. It is for the township offices and the community building.

***Violators may be charged by the Sheriff's Department.***

There are several sanitation companies that provide residential service in our township. Please contact one them for residential service.

### SPRING BURNING SEASON

It's important to know that during the months of March, April and May, outside burning is **NOT PERMITTED** from 6 am to 6 pm. This ban includes burning of yard waste, trash and debris, **even in a proper burn barrel**. However, you ARE permitted to burn during the evening hours of 6 pm to 6 am. Why is this, you ask?

1. Although we typically associate spring with rain, the trees, leaves and underbrush are typically extremely dry from the long, cold winter.
2. Relative humidity increases in the evening. With the absence of the sun, the moisture levels in the air increases, helping to reduce the chance of fire spread.
3. Winds die down in the evening. Although not always true, typically once the sun sets and the air temperature stabilizes, the winds die down as well, also reducing fire spread.
4. It's dark and embers are easier to see. This one is self-explanatory, if a fire was to escape, it is much easier to see the fire spread and get an earlier jump on extinguishing.

When it comes to spring fire season, just remember don't burn anything, until after dark. ALWAYS have a water hose nearby while burning. Also keep a watch on special fire weather statements. There may be additional burn bans in place during Red Flag Weather Days (when fire threats are imminent). Also, as you drive back and forth to town give a glance at the Smokey Bear sign at Forestry Headquarters on US 52. This sign is changed daily, as fire weather changes.

Materials NEVER to be burned at any time or place in Ohio:

- Food waste
- Dead Animals
- Materials containing rubber, grease, asphalt, or made from petroleum

Other restrictions:

- Fires must be more than 1000 feet from neighbor's inhabited building
- No burning when air pollution alert, warning or emergency is in effect
- Fire/smoke cannot obscure visibility on roadway
- No waste generated off the premises may be burned

**Furthermore, this law also applies during the months of October and November.**

### COMMUNITY BUILDING

The community building is available to rent to Nile Township residents **ONLY**. If you wish to rent the building, contact the township office. The cost to rent the building is \$75.

The township will send you a rental agreement along with instructions and payment deadline. The rental agreement **must** be signed by the resident and returned with payment. We accept cash, checks or money orders.

On the day of rental, we will unlock the building at 9am and lock it back at 9pm.

**Renter must complete the following prior to leaving the building:**

- Hang chairs back up
- Clean all tables, counters, microwave, stove top, high chairs, used dishes and coffee pot
- Check bathrooms and clean any messes
- Remove all items from the refrigerator and freezer
- Empty all trash cans and replace bags including kitchen and bathrooms
- Sweep and mop floors including kitchen and bathrooms
- Vacuum rugs

All cleaning supplies and trash bags are located under the kitchen sink.

*If you make a reservation and no longer need it, please call the township to cancel.*

Reservations for 2026 will begin the middle of September 2025.

**FUNERAL DINNERS**-The cost to rent the building for a funeral dinner is **\$25**. The building may only be reserved for a funeral dinner if either of the following applies:

1. The funeral dinner is for a resident of Nile Township.
2. The funeral dinner is for a burial in either Friendship, McKendree or Worley's Run Cemetery.

The Rental Agreement must be signed and the payment must be made prior to using the building.

### WALKING TRACK

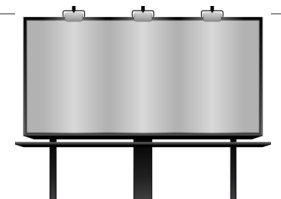
The walking track will be busy as the warm weather returns! If you use the track to walk your dog, please keep your dog on a leash and clean up any messes made by your dog.

There is no charge to use the shelters and reservations are not required; they are always first come, first serve and are available on Saturdays and Sundays ONLY.

Shelter A is the only one that has electrical outlets. Shelter B is located next to the parking lot, and Shelter C is the one closest to US 52.

You are expected to clean up the Shelter before you leave. All trash is to be placed in the dumpster and no decorations or food should be left behind.
